Infection caused from sharing manikins when learning course material and from unclean equipment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Manikins are cleaned prior to every course this includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Face mask of the manikin Change of lungs General wipe of manikin Antibacterial wipes are made available to all candidates when using the manikins 	LOW	LOW
Trips and falls from working in close proximity to other students	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sessions structured so participants have enough space to move freely Suitable venues used adequate to the size of the group 	LOW	LOW
The fire exit being blocked by course material leading to injuries worsening in the event of a fire	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Venue selected suitable to the maximum size of the group Exits to remain clear and people briefed on evacuation procedures 	LOW	LOW
Excessive stress due to sight of blood on PowerPoint or fake blood during scenarios	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Instructors will inform participants at each stage where graphic content may occur Respect the participants choice DO NOT force an individual to participate in an scenario DO NOT deliberately scare participants 	LOW	LOW
Allergic reaction from latex gloves, plasters and antibacterial wipes used in training courses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Candidates asked about any allergies prior to course commencement. Instructors to make candidates aware of potential hazards regarding equipment materials Available alternative equipment: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hypoallergenic plasters Non-alcohol wipes Non latex gloves 	LOW	LOW
